All the students of the college are active members of the Students Union. The student office-bearers are General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, Assistant Cultural Secretary, and Assistant Sports Secretary. All the members are duly elected by the students of this college. All departments are properly represented in the Union.</p> <p>The Student Union plays a significant role in conducting various cultural programmes in the college. Every year the Students Union conducts Freshers' Welcome Programme, Teachers' Day Programme, and also cultural extravaganza on International Women's Day, commemoration of birth anniversaries of great poets, scholars and national leaders. The annual Talent Search Contest conducted by the Students Union provides a platform to young students to showcase their talents in song, dance, elocution, craft, spot acting and many other activities.</p> <p>The Union members are active volunteers in all college programmes organised by different departments and cells. During seminars and workshops attended by faculties and students of neighbouring colleges, they cordially usher in guests, and look after their needs.</p>	5

	<p>Students are members of the Electoral Literacy Club, the Sports and Adventure Club and the Reading Club and they discharge valuable service in their capacity as student-members.</p> <p>At the beginning of every session, the Principal conducts an Orientation Programme for the freshers in which senior students also explain to the newcomers the rules and regulations to be followed, the amenities that are available, about the need to take good care of infrastructural facilities, the need to maintain discipline, while welcoming them warmly to the fold. Due to their initiatives, a healthy bond develops between senior and junior students which is a comforting factor for newcomers trying to adjust to a new milieu and to cope with the pressures of studies.</p>

Many programmes are conducted for the benefit of students and staff members. Fund raised at Reunion has been donated for cancer treatment of an office staff. Every year Alumnae fund provides academic prizes for each general subject. Apart from all these services, the Association also conducts cultural programmes by ex and present students of the college.</p> <p>Number of outreach programmes has also been organized by the Association for the benefits of present and past students and wider community. Awareness programme on cervical cancer was organized in 2016 so as to enable female students in taking proper preventive measures.Two-Day Elocution Workshop organised by Alumnae Association along with the Women’s Study Cell of Women’s Christian College, sponsored by UBCHEA and Alumni Association’ held on 28-29 April, 2017 was an interesting event in which under the tutelage of famous theatre personality Sri JagannathBasu, participants learnt the subtle techniques of elocution. A courtesy visit to an old age home by our students, under the tutelage of the Association brought cheers to the inmates as they found interaction with young people lively and soothing.</p> <p>Association has also contributed much to assets creation. It has contributed a wheel chair to the college for the benefit of a sick student or an unwell staff member. It has also contributed a first aid kit.</p> <p>Another significant development is the installation of grid connected solar PV power plant of array capacity 10kwp, implemented by West Bengal Renewable Energy Development Agency, for which the initiative was taken by the Alumnae Association along with the Eco Club. The college has thus made remarkable progress in ensuring a Green Campus, for which credit is due to the Association and also to the West Bengal government.</p> <p>Another notable step taken by the Association recently is the inauguration of Legal Cell and Stress Prevention Help Desk. Students have been advised to contact the cell whenever they face any violation of their rights in public or private space and require legal assistance.
